Social Skill: I feel statements

Grade-Level Events

- Welcome back to school! As the temperatures are now colder, please ensure you send your child to school with warm clothing (coats, hats, gloves, etc.)!
- Field trip to Clark Planetarium on Thursday, January 23rd

- We have begun teaching the Botvin Life Skills Training Lessons curriculum in class. There are 8 lessons total. Please watch for Parent letters covering each topic that will be taught.

Math

Focus: In Unit 4, 4th graders begin learning about Algebra by working on equations, mathematical comparisons, and word problems.

Examples:

Addition Comparison

Angela is 14 years old. She is 4 years older than Damarcus. How old is Damarcus?

Multiplication Comparison

Shawn colored 5 pages in a coloring book. Brooke colored 4 times as many pages as Shawn colored. How many pages did Brooke color?

Language Arts

Focus: I can summarize the text including the main idea or theme and use more than one supporting detail from the text.

Example: Because all 4th graders are reading 20-30 minutes at home each day, a great way to practice this skill is to ask your child to give a brief summary of what they read. (Even if they read before bed, asking them to summarize their reading the next morning will help develop their brain's ability to recall information.)

Science

Focus: I can create a model that represents the flow of energy in an electric circuit in my home.

Example: Wires are hidden inside the walls of your home. We connect our electric lights and appliances to the electric power in the walls by plugging them into electric sockets. How do you think plugging a lamp into a socket completes a circuit to light the lamp? Draw a picture to show how you think it might work.

Social Studies

Focus: Students will understand the relationship between the physical geography in Utah and human life.



Example: Utah has 3 unique geographical regions with different resources and landscapes that affect how we survive in the land.
