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#### **Math**

We are starting a new math unit. The focus of this section is multiplication and division with fractions.

- We will use comparison bars to solve multiplicative comparison problems involving fractions.
- Use number lines to solve problems involving non-unit fractions.
- Use area models to solve problems involving fractions.
- Use bar models to multiply, compare, and divide fractions.

### **Language Arts**

Focus: I can identify metaphors and similes as types of figurative language.

Similes are used to compare two unlike things using the words like or as.

Example: The teenagers's bedroom smelled as bad as the inside of a garbage can.

Metaphors are a comparison of two unlike things by saying that one thing is a dissimilar object or thing.

Example: My passion for reading is a flame that grows brighter with each book.

#### **Science**

In science we teach the following units.

- Rocks, soils, and landforms
- Mixtures and solutions
- Living systems

#### **Did You Know?**

The density of water is greater than the density of ice. That is why ice floats in a glass of water.

#### **Social Studies**

Focus: Students will describe major events that took place between the colonists and the British which led to a Declaration of Independence.
