#### **Math**

Focus: I can recognize and name 3D shapes.

Example: We have learned the following 3D shapes: cone, cylinder, sphere and cube. Help your child practice by showing them a shape and having them tell you the name. You can also go on shape hunts where you look for these shapes around your house or at a store.

Now would also be a good time to review the 2D shapes that we've learned: square, circle, rectangle, triangle and hexagon.

# **Language Arts**

Focus: Dictation: say a short sentence and have your child repeat it and then write it. Use simple words that students can spell and sight words that have been learned in class. Remind them to use a capital letter at the beginning of the sentence, spaces between words and a period at the end.

#### **Example:**

- The fish is red.
- I have a pet dog.
- He had a big ship.
- I like to run fast.

#### Science

<u>Focus</u>: We are learning about animal needs. We have been learning about animals and butterflies.

<u>Example</u>: Talk about what are the needs of animals. What are similar and different needs.

## **Social Studies**

Focus: I can stand up for myself

Example: This month we are learning what to do if there is a bully. We have talked about what bullying is and what it isn't. We have also learned about kindness and how important it is at school and at home.
