It was an interesting year but our TSSA plan helped support so many programs that helped our students. We paid our teachers stipends for learning and using new programs like Heggerty, Really Great Reading, and 95%. It was nice to have the funds to pay for subs when needed to provide professional development or planning time for our teachers. Our teams worked on creating learning scales and focusing on standards based instruction. It was a highlight to be able to collaborate using data and group students in grades k-3 to start 95% when Covid restrictions loosened up. We saw great gains from our middle of the year to our end of year acadiance and in large part believe that was due to 95%. We were also able to purchase and renew technology that was needed for some of our online students to be successful as well as for our in person students to be one-to-one in grades 3-6.

Our school has made significant growth in both literacy and math. Tracking our Acadiance data we learn that every grade reached the 3% increase in growth, except our first grade who reached 2.6 percent growth. We believe this is from using the new programs to help increase students phonics skill. We will continue the use of Heggerty, Really Great Reading, and 95% Walk to Intervention in order to maintain this growth for the 2021-2022 school year. One thing we have noticed is that we are struggling with our high achieving students that come in to our grade levels blue. It is difficult to push them throughout the year to continue growing. Next year using 95% we want to continue making the 3% gowth in grade K-6 but in addition I would like our focus to be on extending the learning of the students who already have the concepts mastered. We will do this through focusing on providing meaningful extensions explicitly teaching comprehension strategies and providing more meaningful writing opportunities for our highest students.
